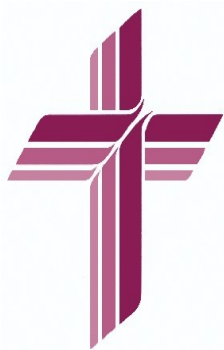

**AARP TAX-AIDE SEEKS  
VOLUNTEERS FOR INCOME TAX  
PREPARATION SEASON**

**Escondido, California**

AARP Tax-Aide, the nation's largest free, volunteer-run tax preparation and assistance service, is seeking volunteers from throughout San Diego North County and East County to provide tax counseling to, and assist in preparing federal and California state tax returns for low- and moderate-income taxpayers, with special attention to taxpayers aged 60 and older.

Volunteer tax Counselors and Client Facilitators provide services at Senior Centers and other community sites in Oceanside, Vista, San Marcos, Carlsbad, Encinitas, Solana Beach, Del Mar, Escondido, Ramona, Fallbrook, Rancho Bernardo, Mira Mesa, Poway, El Cajon, Lakeside, Santee, Lemon Grove, Alpine, San Diego (College Ave), and La Mesa.

Volunteers do not need to be an AARP member or a retiree to join the

team, and those volunteering as Counselors should have recent computer keyboarding experience. Volunteers of all ages and backgrounds, including those bilingual in English/Spanish, are encouraged to apply. Successful volunteers will receive approximately one week of free tax preparation, and computer system classroom training at a local site in January, 2012. From February 1<sup>st</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup>, volunteers will interview taxpayers and prepare tax returns using IRS-approved tax preparation computer software. Volunteers are reimbursed on a limited basis for qualified program-related expenses including travel mileage.

Last year, over 135,000 tax returns were prepared by more than 2,600 volunteers across California. They join the more than 35,000 AARP Tax-Aide volunteers nationwide, helping millions of elderly, low and moderate income taxpayers each year.

## OSTEOPOROSIS

Osteoporosis is called the "silent epidemic" because there are no symptoms and often people are only alerted to the disease when a fracture occurs. According to the National Osteoporosis Foundation, 10 million people in the U.S. are estimated to have osteoporosis. Although it affects both men and women, more than 80% are women, especially white women. These very expensive fractures are caused by low bone density (thickness) which makes the bone more fragile. It is estimated to cost more than \$20 billion annually in the U.S. by 2015.

Some risk factors which may cause this are: low calcium, inadequate Vitamin D, sedentary lifestyle, smoking, advanced age, genetics, thinness and menopausal state. Bone strength depends on bone mineral density (BMD) which is also called bone mass, and can be measured with technology today. It's recommended by the World Health Organization (WHO) that all women age 65 or older have this test regardless of risk factors.

The most common fracture site of osteoporosis is the vertebrae, followed by fracture of the wrist and hip. There is strong evidence that vertebral fracture increase the risk of death. It is recommended that a woman who has lost

height over 12 inches should have an x-ray exam.

According to the WHO, blacks have 1/3 and Asians and Hispanics have about half the risk of hip fractures when compared to white women. Early death is predicted more frequently with hip fractures. Surgery and rehabilitation will most likely be necessary.

Adequate calcium and vitamin D and weight bearing exercises are good measures to prevent osteoporosis. Your physician can best advise you of how to treat possible vitamin/mineral deficiencies. The National Institute of Health (NIH) recommends a daily calcium intake of 1200 mg., yet the diet of the average woman older than age 50 contains about 700 mg. (Low-fat yogurt, cheddar cheese and nonfat milk).

Bones increase in thickness and strength with weight bearing exercises and resistance training. There is evidence that all of the positive effects may be lost when a woman stops exercising. Studies consistently show a significant decrease in falls among women who participate in regular exercise programs, especially those that add balance. Smoking greatly adds to osteoporosis and it appears that more than seven drinks a week do also.

There are medications available to treat this condition and it is important to follow

the physician's instructions precisely if these are prescribed.

If you are not currently getting regular exercise, I suggest you check out the classes offered here at church. Being with friends will make this a social as well as a healthy event. **A THANKFUL RESPONSE FOR GOD'S BLESSINGS**

In many parts of our country October is a month for harvesting crops like corn and soybeans. The Bible in a number of places makes reference to the rejoicing of God's people at the time of harvest. Harvest is truly a good time to remember God's goodness and mercy and raise our songs of thanksgiving

But our rejoicing over the goodness and mercy of God should not be limited to the times of harvest, whether in the summer or the fall, because Jesus taught us pray: ***"Give us this day our daily bread."*** Dr. Martin Luther explained the meaning of that petition with these words: ***"God certainly gives daily bread to everyone without our prayers, even to all evil people, but we pray in this petition that God would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving."***

Traditionally many congregations schedule their stewardship emphases in October or November. That tradition probably started when our society was more agricultural so a thankful response

for God's blessings was appropriate at that time of the year. However, many congregations also put together the next year's budget during October or November and this timing can make stewardship sound more like money rather than anything else.

Stewardship is at its best when it is thought of as whole-life, year-round and for all ages. Our definition of Christian stewardship ***is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes.*** This definition reminds us of the truth that our stewardship is not just a matter of money, but also a matter of sharing the good news of Jesus, using our time, talents and gifts for ministry, and taking care of God's creation and our own bodies, plus so much more. May God help us all throughout the year to understand that while stewardship is often measured in dollars and cents it is much more than that - all of life and life's resources.
